A frequent visitor to the south-east, our man, who often passes this well-located outlet, has long been an admirer of an operation which, in his view, always projects a progressive and business-like atti-

Indeed, our man doubts if there is another tyre depot in the country which displays such a striking array of well-maintained and mod-



tude to even the casual passer-by, straddling a busy road which, on the one hand, leads to the town, and on the other to ern branded signage, ranging from BF Goodrich, to Michelin and Dunlop to mention but three of the quality brands available here. Clearly no half-measures are practised at Meyler's Tyres and Batteries and there's a reassuring sense of order about the outlet, which boasts a terrifically spacious site in a superb location, in addition to a fine workshop, which also houses an overhead storage area for a wide range of tyres, all well displayed and neatly arranged.

On arrival we were greeted promptly by a friendly attendant who invited us into an adequate customer reception area where, on inquiring our needs, he offered us a Nankang for €110 (€5 cheaper than Rocklands Service Station just down the road) while he placed a particular emphasis on a Fulda tyre which retailed at €125.

When we inquired about premium brands, he offered us a Goodyear and a Dunlop both priced at a hefty €165.

The normally busy outlet was surprisingly quiet on the day of our swoop but a number of vans parked at the side of the workshop and emblazoned with the company name, indicated the apparent health of both its 'static' and 'mobile' tyre supply and fitting business.

Our man was particularly impressed by the overall cleanliness of the compound at an outlet, which appears to have gone from strength to strength despite the difficult trading conditions of recent years. And long may that progress continue.
